- library card
- a bill addressed to you at your home address
- passport
- personal check with name and address on it

3 EASY STEPS TO VOTING


1 Pick up your ballot and read all directions carefully.




2 Make your selection by filling in the oval with the pen provided. Make sure you COMPLETELY fill in the oval of the candidate or issue of your choice. If you make an error, please return your ballot to the election official and request a new ballot. If you need to write in a candidate, do so on the line provided and COMPLETELY fill in the corresponding oval.
