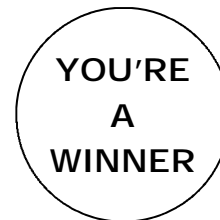
## **Congratulations to our TWO scholarship recipients**

The Westport Town Plan of Conservation for the years 2008-2018 has been drafted and revised and is available for public comment, before October 4<sup>th</sup>, the date of the public comment meeting. The P and Z's final vote will take place on October 25. Suggestions included in the draft plan include additional service stations to be built on the Post Road, raising maximum height allowances on Main Street and installing meters for parking downtown. Perhaps you have views about these and other issues that are addressed in the document. If so, it behooves you to review the Town Plan and comment, as a member of this community. Now is the time to inform yourself and make your opinions known!
